
Dear Parents/Guardians,

At Yealmpton Primary we use The Sentence Toolkit. This is a visual way to help

Below are the tools we are using across Key Stage 1 and a definition of the function/device for writing. It is expected that all these tools are used confidently in independent writing, by the end of Year 2.
